Tips on using this resource:

This mini-lesson is intended for a review of informative writing. Read aloud a suggested mentor text to frontload student knowledge on a topic and complete the mini-lesson as a class or in small groups.

Graphic Organizers & Printables

Bubble Map- Students can use this organizer to brainstorm/research facts and record them Planning My Writing- Students can use this organizer to plan out the three parts to their infor writing: topic sentence, facts and closing sentence.

Generic Publishing Paper-Students can use this publishing paper to create a final draft for nformative writing topic of their choosing.

Literacy Centers

- Provide students with an array of ponfiction books that alian with the provided season writing prompts and roll a topic options. Be sure to check with your school and public life for more free book resources! Use the provided seasonal Epic! book lists as needed. A educator can create a free Epicl Account.
- Post the informative writing rubric, teaching posters & anchor chart at your writing ce set student expectations for their writing and provide reminders of what needs to be in their writing

- Let students know the word bank is there to help them brainstorm and spell if they ne they don't have to use all the words in their writingly
- Students can use provided drawing area to add pictures to their writing to pro-
- Students can independently work through the three steps of the informative writing p gathering facts about their topic, planning and publishing their writing.

Roll-a-topic & Task Cards:

- · Post seasonal Roll-a-topic poster and provide dice (a printable one is included if you Students can use task cards to guide their thinking about the topic they roll.
- Alternatively, just use the roll-a-topic task cards and let students choose one. (Best if don't have books or an information source for one of the topics).



Part 3: Ready to Write






