
#### Apple Pie







#### Before Lesson Using a Mentor Text (optional)

Read aloud a suggested mentor text, such as , to provide a an authentic example of a personal narrative and demonstrate how authors use narrative writing

After reading, use the narrative writing teaching poster to explain to students that in personal narrative writing, authors share an event or series of events that happened to the author with the reader

#### **Personal Narrative Writing** Mini Lesson

#### Part 3 Ready to Write

Using the organizer you filled out together, complete a shared writing about the topic on chart paper.

When the writing is completed reread with students After rereading ask:

- . Are the events of our story in the correct order?
- · Can we add more details to our story?
- What should the title of our story be?

Using the Parts of Narrative Writing anchor chart labels, allow students to label the title, topic sentence, temporal words, details and closing sentence on the anchor chart (see example on next page.)

Students are now ready to write their own personal narrative writing pieces!

You may choose to begin with personal narratives in the beginning of the year and then use the imaginative parrative resources later in the year Read aloud a suggested mentor text to provide examples of narrative writing for students

#### **Personal Narrative Writing** Mini Lesson

Begin this lesson by taking students on a mini field trip out of the classroom. This could a be a nature walk around the school or playing a whole class game out on the playground. You could also use a recent field trip or any event the whole class has experienced

This experience will be used to create a shared writing about the events that happened.

#### Part 2 Organizing our Writing

As you fill out the organizer, remind students that all narratives have a topic, sequ

As you prompt students to recall details, use temporal words and help them correctly sequence events. Model sequencing events incorrectly and have students help correctly

- What happened next?
- What was the last thing that happened?
